SAFETY TIP

First it's time to make sure your machine is as ready for it as you are. Before every ride, but especially after a lay-off of any length, always carry out a POWER CC check as recommended by the Institute of Advanced Motorists:

<u>Petrol</u>. - Ensure you have a full tank of fuel before you arrive for any group ride. Road Captains will have planned fuel stops, when necessary, based on the fact that everybody will have a full tank to start with.

Oil. - Check and top-up oil before every trip. Just because it didn't seem to need any last time doesn't mean it won't need some this time. Driving with insufficient oil, especially in hot weather will prove expensive or even deadly.

<u>Water.</u> - Got a V-Rod ? Check the radiator. Water is just as essential as oil.

<u>Electrics.</u> - Do the indicators, headlights, stop lights and running lights work properly? Also, check for any warning lights ?

Rubber. - Physically check both tyres for damage and wear. Not only could they be illegal – they could prove lethal. Check the tyre pressures when you fill up – before every trip. It's amazing what a difference air temperature can make to tyre pressures. Also, don't forget to make adjustments to the tyre pressures if you plan to carry a pillion (or lots of luggage for a rally).

<u>Cables.</u> - Check for wear or fraying and replace any damaged ones without delay.

Chain, Or in our case Drive Belt of course. When was the last time you checked the tension/slack and wear in your belt conform to the handbook recommendations? All this is probably in the realms of sucked eggs for grandmothers for most – but be honest, when did you last do a POWER CC check on your bike?

<u>Brakes</u> - Check your brakes are fully functional. After a lay-up over winter, pads have been known to disintegrate and discs may have become corroded. Making an emergency stop on the motorway is not the best time to discover this.

Also, don't forget to make adjustments to the suspension pre-sets or pneumatic pressure if you plan to carry a pillion. An extra few stone perched on the back moves the centre of gravity backwards and upwards and increases momentum significantly. Give

the machine, and yourself, the best chance possible to deal with the changed handling characteristics.

Ride safe and have fun.

AFGHAN HEROES -

The Afghan Heroes Charity was set as a result of an idea that a mother of a soldier had, after her son had been killed following an explosion in Afghanistan last July. It's purpose is to provide support for those directly involved in the conflict.

To support this Charity, a Mother's Day Bikers Ride was set up with online registration. The intension was to attract around 3000 bikers to parade their support through the village of Wooten Bassett. Support far exceeded their expectations and registration was

closed earlier than expected following Police advice, when the number of bikes had surpassed 10,000. In fact including Pillions over 15,000 had registered.

Having registered, it was at this point, I was deeply concerned with reference to safety factor of attending this event. How wrong I was, and boy am I glad I decided to attend.

It had been "Tall decided by Dave", who had organised the Chapter's ride down, to meet a 6.30am at the A14 Services near Kettering. Allowing for a couple of stops and our



allocated arrival time of 10am, he was right, there was no getting out of such an early start. Yes, it was chilly but it wasn't that bad – no girly heated grips or gloves for me! As daylight began to break, with 16 bikes in tow, we headed off and as the sun came out, it became quite pleasant.


the airfield, but there were plenty of refreshment and toilet facilities. Each group that left had its own Police escort and the ride was at gentle respectful pace. The




Sun 23rd May - Matlock Bath


