

## HOGGIN THE BRIDGE 10 – 18<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER 2009

Hoggin the Bridge takes place over the river Severn and is traditionally the last long ride of the year, due to the changing weather. This year we all agreed to meet at the Corley Services



on the M6 at 0730. Three of us set off from Stamford at 0615 and by Corby our fingers were frozen, but at least it was dry unlike other years.

As planned we all met at Corley services and set sail to the Services at Junction 1 of the M48, the Event start location. You can pay

£10 on the day, but it is very advisable to pay in advance because it's mayhem at the start. Not sure how many bikes of all makes were there, but it had to be around 4000, if not more. For your £10 you get an Event Pin and a T shirt, and the rest goes to charity. The start is a tad fraught due to the number of bikes and trike's, all trying to exit the services, but the Event it's self is well marshalled by Bridgewater Chapter, with the help of the police. Once on the bridge, with its stunning views, we speed up a bit for the 25 mile ride around the Welsh countryside, lined with huge numbers of well wishers, standing on the route waving and cheering. Eventually the ride finishes in the lovely Welsh town of Chepstow. There you can pick up your pre ordered T shirt and pin, and get a bite to eat from the many pubs and cafes all of which do a raring trade. You can leave your helmet and coat if



you wish with the Christian motorcycle club for a £1, which goes to charity and there is normally a group playing in the square and a few trade stands. We set off around 1445 for the uneventful ride home stopping twice for a break and go go juice, getting home just as darkness

## **GUARDIAN BELLS**

Like me, I'm sure you've seen many motorcycles with a metal bell attached to them. Have you wondered why this is? Legend has it that Evil Road Spirits have been attaching themselves on to motorcycles for as long as there have been



bikes on the road. These Evil Road Spirits are responsible for mechanical problems and bad luck along a journey. It goes on to say, that by attaching a small bell onto your bike, the Evil Road Spirits will become trapped inside the bell, where the constant ringing drives them insane,

making them lose their grip until they fall to the ground. Legend also has it that the mystery of the Guardian Bell carries twice as

much power when it is purchased by a friend or loved one, then given as a gift. It is also said that the bell should be located as close to the ground as possible.

## WHITEWALL TYRES



Whitewall tyres offer a more "classic" look for certain bikes and to be sure they aren't meant for all bikes. (Don't look for them on a Vrod). Whitewall motorcycle tyres take their styling cues from the fashion history of white sidewall tyres on cars. Early car tyres were at one time all white, which was a result of the use of natural white

rubber. Unfortunately, natural white rubber didn't provide enough traction or endurance. The solution was to add black carbon initially just to the part that was in contact with the road surface, resulting in the whitewall as we know it today Eventually black carbon was added to the whole tyre for ease of cleaning.. So, you get a sense of how the fashion of whitewall tyres evolved in relation to black wall tyres. They didn't, it was the other way round!

### RTTW 2



Following on from the success of RTTW 1 in 2008, when an estimated 2500 bikes turned up to pay their respects, and remember our fallen heroes. RTTW 2 on Saturday 10th October was an obvious inclusion into this year's calendar. This year,

departure location had been changed to Drayton Manor Leisure Park, on the outskirts of Tamworth, because Tamworth Services the previous year had struggled to cope with the numbers involved. Rutland Chapters planned ride to the event, was to leave Sycamores at 8.30am, with the intention to arrive at Drayton Manor at around 10am, in plenty of time before the official event departure time of 11am.

I found Shep and Janet, Smithy was there to, quite rightly so to, as he was playing the Bagpipes at the Event, but what the hell was Fulton doing in the Flag Bearers area! By the way, thanks go to Andy from Sycamores, for arranging and paying for our Chapter's Wreath, I for one thought it was embarrassing last year, not to have one.

The ride began promptly at 11am, we actually went out of the gates of Drayton Manor at 11.45am, and we were about half way! The streets of the

I thought it seemed better organised than last year, but I suspect that was down to them being better prepared for the numbers that turned up.

The Spitfire flypast was superb, no I am wrong it was absolutely awesome, its sound is so distinctive!


**Date: 14 December 2009**By Tara Dundon

## RUTLAND CHAPTER WEBSITE USER GUIDE

This guide is intended to aid Chapter Members in the use of the most commonly used areas, of the Rutland Chapter Website. Hope you find it of help.

### **Web Address and Access**

The address of the Chapter Website is http://www.rutlandchapter.co.uk

Only the **Members** area is password protected. You can access the **Events Calendar**, **Photo Sections** and even upload a message to the **Guestbook**, without having a Members Password. Just click on the section you wish to visit. ie: Calendar

## Photos Guestbook

### Members Area

To access the **Members** area you need to be a Chapter Member. Click Members from the homepage to enter.

<u>Password Requests</u> – At the login page, on the left underneath the Username and Password you will see the link <u>Request Password</u>, click this, and fill in your name, email and requested username (username is the name you wish to use on the forum). Click **Submit Request** and your request will automatically be sent to the Chapter Webmaster, who will email you back confirming your username and will include your unique 6 figure password. (Passwords can take up to a couple of days and will only be processed during office hours)

Access – Once you have your Username and Password you can access the Members area by clicking on Members , then entering your Username and Password on the left where prompted. Click **Login** and you will automatically be taken to the Rutland Chapter Members Area.

Newsletters and Committee Minutes Section – All previous Newsletters and Meeting Minutes can be viewed here, just click the dated link of the one you wish to view. Latest Newsletters and Minutes are uploaded here as and when they are published.

<u>Members Forum</u> – You access the Members Forum by clicking on the Members Only Forum picture. A pop-up will appear requesting a password, type in **rutland**, and then click **Login**. You will automatically enter the forum.

The forum can be viewed in 2 formats, board or threaded. To change between formats click on either **Board** or **Threaded**, located midway down the right hand side of the pop-up window. Board is definitely the best format for everyday use <u>Board</u> - always displays the topic with the latest post at the top and by clicking the topic description, you will automatically view all the posts on that topic. To post a reply, click **reply** on the last post, then type your message in the box provided and click post message at the bottom of the window. Your message will appear on the forum immediately.

<u>Threaded</u> – always displays latest topic at the top, and posts can only viewed individually. To post a reply, click **reply** on the post you wish to reply to, then type your message in the box provided and click post message at the bottom of the window. Your message will appear on the forum immediately.

### **Photo Section**

From the home page click Photos to enter.

<u>View latest Event Photos</u> – Click on the Rutland Chapters Photo Centre icon, and a new window will appear, with photos from lots of events. The latest event photos are towards the bottom. Click on the Event you wish to view and all the photos from that event will appear. Click on individual photos to enlarge and you will be offered a slideshow option at the top of the window.

 $\underline{\text{\bf Uploading \ Photos}}$  - All Chapter members can upload event photos to the website.

All photos must not be larger than 1mb, to reduce the photo size, open the photo in **paint**, and resize in both horizontally and vertically to 80%.

Whilst in the Rutland Chapter Photo Centre, click on the **public uploader** link, this is located on the left, at the bottom of the listed events. This will open a new window, enter your email address in the box and click **browse** to locate on your computer to select the photos you wish to upload. After a few seconds you will be prompted to add a **photo title**. The photo title should be

added as follows: year/month event title. (ie: the 2009 Toy Run, which takes place in December would be added as **09/12 Toy Run**) You can upload up to 5 photos at the same time. Once you have completed the above click **Finish Uploading Photos** and your photos will automatically be sent to the Chapter Webmaster for processing. Once processed, the photos will appear in the Chapter Photo Centre, under the title that you entered. (Processing only takes place during normal office hours)

## **Event Calendar**

From the home page click Calendar to enter.

Click the **Rutland Chapter Event Calendar** icon and a new window will open containing the current events calendar. If you want more details on one of the listed events, click on the event title, and more details will appear.
