


SCRATCHY'S SCRIBBLINGS

As mentioned earlier in this Newsletter our 2012 Horseshoe Rally will be held, where it should be, in the heart of beautiful Rutland. Finally we've managed to find a campsite, on the banks of Rutland Water, with fantastic views out over it.



Lyndon Top Campsite is located between the villages of Manton and Edith Weston on the South Shore of Rutland Water. The site includes a large brick barn where we will be holding the night time entertainment.



There are no permanent onsite Toilets and Showers, so we have hired mobile units to support the event. Shower trailer is a 4 Shower Unisex unit.

We will continue to revue ticket sales and order more if required.





Obviously we need a bar there, so we have booked the same outside mobile unit, used successfully by Sherwood Chapter for the last few years. The owner is a HOG member and is familiar with our needs, they are fully self supported units and most importantly their prices are reasonable.



Catering is currently being looked into and I'm confident that we will be able to get what we want. This is to mirror the catering provided by Market Harborough Rugby Club for the Riders Club and Nene Valley Rallies. Good food at a reasonable price! That's the beauty of attending other Rallies; you get to see what works and what doesn't.



Unfortunately other than camping, there is no onsite accommodation; however there are plenty of B&B's and Hotels in the area to meet all pockets. Check out accommodation in the villages of Manton, Edith Weston and Normanton if you wish to stay nearby.



Our Chapter and our Rally over the past few years has developed enough to allow us to both financially and numerically make this move. Yes it will be more work, yes it will cost us more, but we now have the finances and support to pull this off.
